### Achoimre ar an bPost:

Cuireann Scoil an Leighis Tréidliachta UCD cláir chéime ar fáil sa Leighias Tréidliachta agus san Altranais Tréidliachta. Cuireann saotharlanna diagnóiseacha Ospidéal Tréidliachta UCD (UCDVH) saineolas cuimsitheach ar fáil do thaighde talmhaíochta, leighis, agus tréidliachta, chomh maith le seirbhísí inmheánacha tapa do chleachtóirí ar fud na tíre. Ina theannta sin, tacaíonn na saotharlanna le hoideachas mac léinn bithleighis, altranais tréidliachta, agus leighis tréidliachta trína gcuid oibre diagnóiseach. Riartar gach anailís ar shamplaí ainmhithe amháin.

Is mian linn Oifigeach Teicniúil a earcú le bheidh mar chuid den fhoireann laistigh de Phaiteolaíocht Chliniciúil. Beidh cáilíochtaí, oiliúint, agus taithí ábhartha i réimse na tréidliachta nó na paiteolaíochta cliniciúla ag an iarrthóir rathúil. Oibreoidh siad as a stuaim féin agus beidh eitic oibre láidir, sárscileanna teicniúla, agus cumarsáide den chéad scoth ó bhéal agus i scríbhinn acu.

Chomh maith leis na Príomhdhualgais agus Freagrachtaí, beidh an ceapáí freagrach as na nithe seo a leanas:

- Samplaí a ghlacadh, a phróiseáil, anailís a dhéanamh orthu, agus sonraí a chur isteach i gCóras Bainistíochta Faisnéise na Saotharlainne (LIMS) i gcomhréir leis na Nósanna Imeachta Oibriúcháin Caighdeánacha (SOPs), ar fud fho-dhisciplíní na Paiteolaíochta Cliniciúla Tréidliachta, lena n-áirítear an haemateolaíocht, an chíteolaíocht agus an Bhithcheimic Chliniciúil.
- Measúnú criticiúil a dhéanamh ar cháilíocht agus ar chruinneas na dtorthaí, sula ndéantar iad a cheadú agus a scaoileadh.
- Tacaíocht a sholáthar do na paiteolaithe cliniciúla maidir le cúrsaí teagasc, agus páirt ghníomhach a ghlacadh in oiliúint mac léinn bithleighis, altranais tréidliachta, agus leighis tréidliachta (idir fhochéimithe agus iarchéimithe) chomh maith le cleachtóirí, i dteicnící saotharlainne cliniciúla.
- Comhoibriú leis an bhfoireann paiteolaíochta i bhforbairt, deimhniú, agus, cur i bhfeidhm modheolaíochtaí nua diagnóiseacha,
- Tabhairt faoi fhorbairt ghairmiúil leanúnach de réir riachtanais paiteolaíochta.
- Cumarsáid éifeachtach a dhéanamh le foireann UCDVH agus le cleachtas tréidliachta seachtracha maidir le ceanglais i leith samplaí a chur isteach, próisis anailíseacha, agus tuairisciú torthaí.

- Páirt a ghlacadh i gcláir maidir le rialúchán cáilíochta agus dearbhú cáilíochta inmheánacha agus seachtracha chun clóigh le ceanglais na Scéime Creidiúnaithe Saotharlainne.
