Achoimre ar an bPost:

Is mian le Scoil an Leighis Tréidliachta UCD Cliniceoir Speisialaithe in Ainéistéis agus Anailgéis Tréidliachta sealadach a cheapadh. Mairfidh an ceapachán ar feadh 36 mhí.

Tá trealamh den chéad scoth ag Ospidéal Tréidliachta UCD, lena n-áirítear CT, MRI, ultrafhuaim, radaeolaíocht idirghabhálach, ionscópacht agus artrascópacht, léasar, aonad iaidín radaighníomhach agus seomraí máinliachta agus dianchúraim lánfheistithe. Áirítear leis an tacaíocht choimhdeach athshlánú agus fisiteiripe.

Is ionad atreoraithe ilspeciasach, ildisciplíneach mór é Ospidéal Tréidliachta UCD le raon iomlán Speisialtóirí cliniciúla.

Selection criteria outline the qualifications, skills, knowledge and/or experience that the successful candidate would need to demonstrate for successful discharge of the responsibilities of the post. Applications will be assessed on the basis of how well candidates satisfy these criteria.

Mandatory:

Experience and Qualifications

- A Veterinary Degree registerable with the Veterinary Council of Ireland.
- A specialist qualification in Veterinary Anaesthesia, namely the European College of Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia Diploma (DipECVAA) or the American College of Veterinary Anaesthesia and Analgesia (DACVAA). Consideration will also be given to those candidates who have completed their specialist training and are eligible to sit their final certifying examinations in the immediate future.
- Clinical experience in Veterinary Anaesthesia, ideally within an academic environment or specialist referral centre.
- Experience in supervision of residents or interns.
- Genuine interest in and enthusiasm for teaching and learning.
- Effective interpersonal skills and ability to work as a team member.
- Excellent written and oral communication skills.
- Computer literacy.
- Candidates must demonstrate how they can positively contribute to fostering an inclusive environment and a level of awareness of equality, diversity and inclusion.
